
The steel dies coordinating with the stamps still are a favorite thing for me in the kits. Today, I want to share a simple but effective technique to try with these dies: creating a shadow effect!

## SUPPLY LIST:

Sandlot Card kit; Teacher's Pet Stamp and Die Set; Martha Stewart Glue Pen; Tiny Attacher; other - die cut machine, washi tape









Step 01: Cut a mat to the height of your cardbase (in my case 4.25 inches) and width of your liking.

Step 02: Place your die on top of said mat and adhere it with washi tape.

Step 03: Crank the mat and die through your die cut machine. You are left with a negative and a positive image of your die cut.













Step 04: Dig through your paper stash to find a contrasting patterned paper. This will go behind the mat to create the "shadow".

Step 05: Put some adhesive on the back of your die cut (positive). For intricate cuts, the Martha Stewart glue pen is awesome to work with.

Step 06: Layer the positive and negative die cut on top of each other but slightly offset to the right.

Step 07: Adhere the mat with your die cuts on the card base with the contrasting patterned paper sandwiched in-between and embellish your project.
